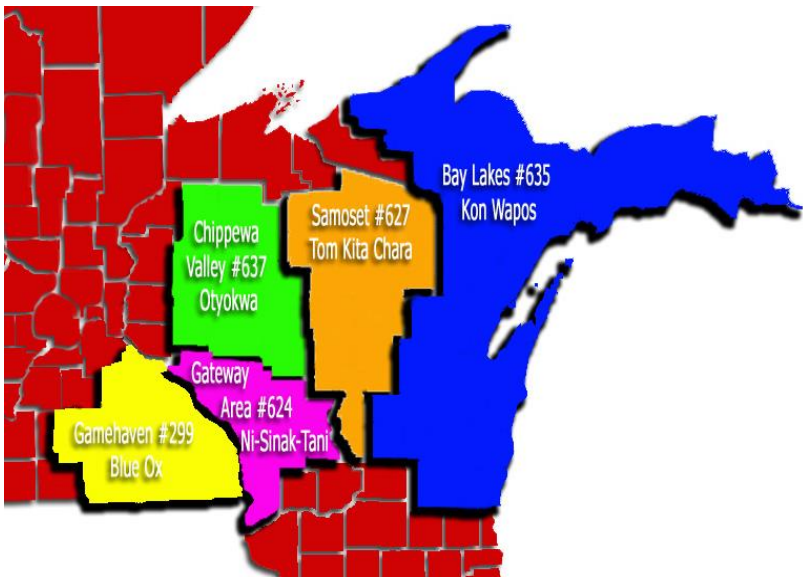

## CODE OF CONDUCT

---

The principles of the Scout Oath and Law as well as the Policies and Procedures of the Boy Scouts of America are the foundation of the Chippewa Valley Council Camp Program including:

1. Alcoholic beverages and illegal drugs are not permitted anywhere at L.E. Phillips Scout Reservation.
2. Smoking and other tobacco use is not allowed anywhere at Camp Phillips.
3. The speed limit at camp is 15 mph at all times.
4. Only official camp vehicles are allowed on roads beyond the central camp parking lot. No personal vehicles are allowed to stay in campsites. Those who need to use a vehicle for medical reasons must obtain a vehicle permit from the Medical Officer.
5. Scout leaders, Scouts, and visitors who are arriving or departing camp must check in or out at the office in the Administration Building.
6. Shoes must be worn at all times, except on the beach, in the shower, and in personal housing.
7. The buddy system shall be used by Scouts at all times.
8. Scouts should be mindful of their technology use while at camp. It is important to disconnect and be focused on the fun you are having.

---

## **Unit Election Rate**

What is the very first step in becoming an arrowman? In this training, you will learn about this first step, the unit elections for your lodge, and how to calculate the metric to judge your lodge's effectiveness its unit elections. You will learn why this is important in the Order of the Arrow today, and how we aim to improve this metric.

## **Induction Rate**

Getting people into the Order of the Arrow is a big problem. With this training, you will go over what the induction rate means, and current trends. You will also learn new strategies on how to improve your lodge's induction rate to get more people into your lodge.

## **Activation Rate**

A newly elected arrowman just did their ordeal, but now what? Here you will learn about getting people past their ordeal and become what is known as an activated arrowman. You will also go over some strategies to keep arrowmen coming to events.

# COUNCIL OF CHIEFS (COC) INFORMATION

---

## **SECTION OFFICER POSITIONS**

Have you been really involved in the Order and your Lodge? Are you looking for a different experience that can keep you involved, yet offer new challenges? If so, then you should consider being a Section C-1B Officer. There are two basic requirements: 1) You will be under 21 years of age for the entire term of office; 2) Be a registered member of the BSA and in good standing with a Lodge and Council within Section C-1B. In addition, you must obtain, in advance, written approval from your respective Scout Executive. **All interested candidates must talk to the Section Adviser (Shawn Keifenheim) by noon Saturday.**

## **OFFICER RESPONSIBILITIES**

**Chief:** Presides over meetings of the Council of Chiefs. He provides leadership and motivation at all functions and represents the Section at area, regional, and national functions to which he is invited.

**Vice Chief:** Fills in for the Chief as needed, ensures the Section Conclave is promoted in each of the Lodges, and chairs the Lodge Partnership Program.

**Secretary:** Takes minutes for all meetings and keeps an up-to-date roster of the Council of Chiefs. Serves as a member of the Central Region Communication team.

Section Officers must attend four meetings each year. Necessary transportation and housing will be provided. The meetings are:

- Section Officer Seminar (November 14-17, 2019)
- Winter Council of Chiefs (January 24-26, 2020)
- Spring Council of Chiefs (April 17-19, 2020)
